At the Resource Center for Accessible Living (RCAL), we know how life-changing the right support can be when it comes to entering—or reentering—the workforce. That's why we are proud to host Access-VR Orientations on the first Thursday of each month at 10:00 a.m. at our office, located at 727 Ulster Avenue in Kingston, NY.

Access-VR (Adult Career and Continuing Education Services – Vocational Rehabilitation) is a statewide program that helps individuals with disabilities prepare for, find, and maintain meaningful employment. Whether someone is seeking their first job, transitioning into a new career, or returning to work after an injury or illness, Access-VR provides the tools, training, and guidance needed to succeed.



Marsha will help guide participants through their journey, ensuring they receive personalized support every step of the way.



Here's how the process works: after attending an orientation, participants are paired with a counselor who works one-on-one with them to identify strengths, explore job goals, and determine the services they need. This may include skills training, job readiness preparation, educational opportunities, assistive technology, or direct job placement support. From there, individuals move forward with a clear plan and a committed partner to help them achieve their employment goals.

RCAL is proud to be part of this vital pathway to independence and self-sufficiency. By connecting individuals with Access-VR, we're not only helping people find work—we're helping them build confidence, financial stability, and a greater sense of community belonging.
