RCAL'S Vision in Action: Programs That Change Lives

At 9 a.m. each morning, the phones at RCAL begin to ring. On the other end are neighbors, parents, caregivers, and individuals from across Ulster County, all seeking help, guidance, and support. With school back in session, one of the most frequent requests comes from parents in need of educational advocacy. They turn to our Special Education Advocate, Renee Falanga-Brenner, who works tirelessly to ensure children with disabilities receive the services and supports they are entitled to. From early intervention through high school and transition planning, Renee helps parents interpret test results, navigate the complexities of IEPs and 504 plans, and work collaboratively with schools to secure individualized, meaningful educational opportunities.



Of course. educational advocacy is just one piece of what RCAL does. Our Benefits Advisement team with two Debbie advisors, Denise and Todd Martin-works help daily to individuals navigate the complex world of benefits including

SSI, SSDI, Medicaid, and Medicare. To expand access, we've begun offering on-site Benefits Advisement at the Trudy Resnick Farber Center each month and at the Broadway Bubble in Kingston on the first Wednesday.

Our Medical Loan Closet is another lifeline for the community. One of RCAL's busiest programs, it provides durable medical equipment such as wheelchairs, walkers, and shower chairs—ensuring that no one has to go without the tools they need to live safely and independently.

For individuals who need help managing their money, RCAL offers a Representative Payee program, ensuring that Social Security benefits are handled responsibly and that essential expenses like rent and utilities are covered.

Accessibility starts at home and in our community spaces. That's why our Architectural Modification Consulting program helps identify and plan changes—such as ramps, bathroom modifications, and accessible entrances—that make living spaces safer and more inclusive.

Families also rely on RCAL's Community Habilitation and Respite services, which provide crucial supports for daily living and give caregivers a much-needed break, knowing their loved ones are in capable hands.

And at the core of everything we do is Information and Referral. Ulster County is fortunate to have a wealth of services—from food pantries and physical therapy to legal and housing resources—but knowing where to start can

be overwhelming. RCAL staff connect individuals with the right programs and supports, helping them achieve an enhanced quality of life.


